Annual seasonal flu vaccination is now due

All children from reception to year 11 are being offered a free flu vaccination in school, as part of the national vaccination programme. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and make some people seriously ill. The flu vaccination is **safe and effective**. It helps to protect against seasonal flu and serious related complications, such as bronchitis, ear infections and pneumonia. It will also help to prevent the spread of flu and protect others who are vulnerable. There are two different types of vaccine available:

Nasal spray flu vaccine

This vaccine offers the best protection against flu. It is given as a spray, squirted up each nostril. It's quick and painless.

For some children the nasal spray is not suitable for medical reasons. Our team will review the medical information submitted before offering the flu vaccine.

The nasal vaccine contains traces of a highly processed form of porcine gelatine.

Flu vaccine injection

The injection is given into the muscle in the upper arm, which may cause soreness.

This vaccine is offered as an alternative if the nasal spray is not suitable due to medical reasons or personal choice. This vaccine does **not** contain porcine gelatine

We will only give primary school aged children the flu vaccination if we have your consent. Please do this as soon as possible, using the instructions below. You only need to submit your decision once.

How to give or refuse consent for your child to get the flu vaccination

- On the consent declaration page, you can consent for the nasal flu vaccine, the injectable flu vaccine or refuse consent.
- You will receive a confirmation email when the form is submitted.

If you are unable to complete the form online, please call us on **0300 300 0007** or e-mail lpt.sais@nhs.net with your contact details. If you change your mind about your consent decision, please call us on the number above to change it.

Parents and carers will be contacted directly by text and/or email about when the flu vaccination session will take place. **The online consent system will close one working day before the vaccination session.** You will not be able to submit a consent form on the day.

Frequently asked questions

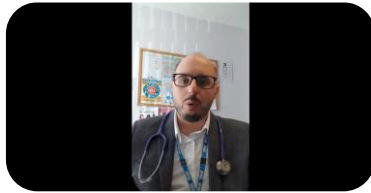
My child has a health condition and normally has the vaccine from the GP.	They are also able to have the vaccination at school.
What are the side effects of having the flu immunisation?	Children may develop a runny or blocked nose, headache, general tiredness and some loss of appetite. These symptoms are much milder than developing flu or complications associated with flu. Serious side-effects are uncommon.
Why is there a new flu immunisation every year?	Flu viruses change every year, so flu vaccines are updated to protect against the latest strains.

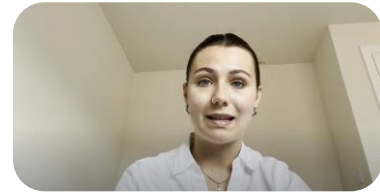

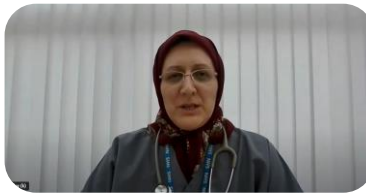

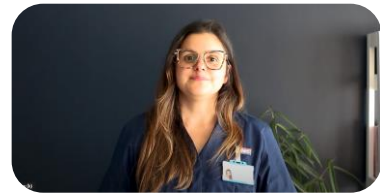
